Mayors Report - September 2016

Back-to-School Safety – School is now back in session in all four of our counties. Please use extra caution when traveling throughout our town and in all communities in the four county area especially during school bus pick-up and drop-off times. Be mindful of our students who walk to school and approach crosswalks with care. We wish all students and teachers a great 2016-2017 school year!

Police Force Update - Our new Chief of Police, Doug Reitz, was sworn in on August 1st and has since been identifying critical needs associated with building our municipal police force and exploring options to meet those needs. We have selected the most qualified candidate for the Police Services Administrator position. Additionally, we are now finalizing the structure to begin hiring our staff of 10 officers. No timeline has been established to convert over from The Resident State Trooper Program to date. Chief Reitz has been partnering with allied law enforcement agencies over the past several weeks working on the logistical issues associated with the transition to a municipal police force. We are progressing forward, but doing so methodically to ensure the highest level of public safety protection possible. Lastly, I'm proud to announce the creation of the design for the Town's first police force badge. After receiving community input, Chief Reitz worked with a local business to finalize the badge logo. The phrase "Two Counties, One Community" will be incorporated into the badge design reflecting upon the Town's unique characteristic of being located in Carroll and Frederick Counties and honoring the spirit of the community that transcends county lines.

Revitalization - We proudly welcome the "New" Mt. Airy Health and Wellness Pavilion to Mount Airy. The Mount Airy Health and Wellness Pavilion is a joint venture between Carroll Hospital Center and Frederick Memorial Hospital and represents a multi-million dollar investment aimed at providing quality medical services to Mount Airy and surrounding communities. The center will provide general practitioner services, radiology, physical therapy, and community wellness programs.
