
**November 20, Big Country Breakfast** 7:30 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. will be held at the Mt. Airy Volunteer Fire Company Building.



# **MXD** Draft Ordinance **Nearing Completion**

In a subcommittee group in 2014, the development of a new zoning classification to Mount Airy began called the Mixed Use District (MXD) Ordinance. It includes insights from Planning, Board of Appeals, Real Estate, and Development backgrounds to achieve a balanced zone that will ensure creative development scenarios, yet also compliment other areas of town. The October Planning Commission meeting will be reserved for a work session to wrap up comments, make final touches, and hopefully forward to the Town Council for introduction in November. As the Planning Commission is wrapping up the MXD, the Commission will be transitioning into working on the Sign Ordinance. A work session will be scheduled in the fall. The concept plans for Brittany Manor and Wildwood Park VII were approved at the April and August Planning Commission meetings. These proposed residential developments are planned for infill areas already existing within the town. Brittany Manor is a 73 -unit single family development accessible from Back Acre Circle and Wildwood Park VII has proposed a section of 60-units of senior apartments or condominiums. The Planning Commission meets on the last Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in Town Hall.

**Economic Development** 

The Economic Development Commission has been studying the expansion of parking Downtown, with member Mr. Frank Dertzbaugh, providing a concept solution called "Esplanade Parking". This term refers to a bridge of parking that would stretch from Hood Street to the "Caboose Parking Lot" behind the existing Downtown buildings along Hotel Street. This concept idea was brought before the Mayor and Town Council for their input. As a result, the Downtown Parking Committee was formed to continue the study to further identify the best area for additional parking, looking at six other potential areas. The Committee determined that multiple parking areas are needing to be constructed to address customer convenience and safety. New business incentives are being considered to offer assistance for businesses retention, expansion and attraction to Mount Airy. Business surveys are being generated for the Commission to study the best way to assist in the business incentive programs.

### Streets and Roads Updates

Road repaying projects will occur at the end of the fiscal year, in the spring and summer of 2017. This year white and double yellow lines were able to be repainted. Lines are on the schedule for maintenance every two years. Those arrows and other road markings are on the schedule for later this year. A request was placed to the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) as to the difficulty with making a left turn from South Main Street onto Northbound Route 27. Confusion comes in from the two through lanes of oncoming traffic from the exit ramp of I-70 East coming into Town. The driver turning left from South Main Street can be confused by both lanes having the through designation. Mr. Larry Hushour, Chairman of the Board of Parks and Recreation has requested participation from the Streets and Roads Commission with the development a request to the SHA for funding of a pedestrian crossing on Route 27 at Center Street as part of the Rail Trail extended. Sabra, Wang & Associates Inc., the consultant performing the Route 27 Corridor Study hosted a community forum on June 15, 2016 at the Fireman's Activities Building. Information on the project can be found via the new website www.route27corridorstudy.com. The Streets and Roads Commission meet on the even numbered months on the 4th Thursday at 7:30 p.m.

#### Can I Flush this? Probably Not.

Companies promote flushable wipes, towelettes, cleansing cloths, kitty litter, diapers, etc. as convenient and safe. The Water & Sewer Commission reminds everyone that flushable simply means it will go down your toilet. It does not mean that it cannot clog your sewer line. A sewer line blockage can



be expensive and extremely unpleasant. What can you do? Only flush toilet paper down the toilet. Toss wipes, towelettes, cleansing cloths, etc. into trash receptacles where they belong. It is as simple as that!

As an initiative to encourage economic development, the Commission reviewed current water usage and future demand to determine that approximately 81,000 gallons per day could be assigned by the Planning Commission to new development within the Town. The Town Council approved the recommendation. The Planning Commission will manage the assignment of the water to individual development and redevelopment projects. Join the Water and Sewer Commission today as a volunteer and help ensure that Mount Airy continues to provide one of the best water and sewer systems in the state. Water and Sewer Commission meetings are held the 1st Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. in Town Hall.

#### Parks and Recreation

Reminder and Announcement: As of new Ordinance 2016-4, "the use of tobacco products and tobacco substitute products are prohibited in town parks, including the Town's Rails to Trails pathways and associated properties."

The Board of Parks and Recreation had a fun year of 5K's and Fun Runs. The Board has created an Official 5K Route available for anyone who would like to start their own 5K event. The board is purchasing new route marker signs to pair with the Route.

We thank the Mount Airy Youth Athletic Association (MAYAA), Four County Little League (FCLL), and the Mount Airy Main Street Association (MAMSA) for hosting five movie nights this summer! #### Recycling and Sanitation

For a Commission that only meets every other month, Recycling and Sanitation volunteers work hard and accomplish mountains of work each time they get together. Working with Ms. Annmarie Creamer, Frederick County's Recycling Outreach Program Coordinator, the Commission

is discussing a mobile app for Mount Airy residents. Frederick County residents already have the app available for download, called "My Waste" through Municipal Media Inc. There is a schedule feature to learn



recycling pick-up dates, especially important for when a weekday holiday can change the normal schedule. Other features include, "What Goes Where?" for the user to search for a specific material to be disposed, such as batteries or Styrofoam. It will guide the user through the appropriate disposal process. Take the "Be a Better Recycler" Quiz or report a problem related to recycling and sanitation. Ms. Creamer reported "13,000 out of 76,000 Frederick County residents have downloaded the app already and the app is on their website, so those without a mobile device can still access it."

Several residents have questioned the Town about the persistent delivery of free newspapers to mailboxes, driveways, yards, and sidewalks. The Town of Mount Airy advises any resident who wishes to stop receiving the newspapers to contact the paper directly and request to be removed from their distribution list.

Chairman Jim Stargel has taken the initiative along with several mem bers of the Commission to begin a Mount Airy "Green Team". The goal is for the Town to become Sustainable Maryland Certified. Mount Airy would like to join other munici-

palities in Maryland to gain the designation, which will tally points toward the designation for new and existing programs in Mount Airy related to going green and saving money to sustain the quality of life for many generations to come. The Town is already going green through the Farmer's Market program, hosting a local business directory, and other measures. Recycling and Sanitation Commission meet on the odd numbered months every 3rd Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. in Town Hall. Green Team meetings are on the even numbered months at 7:00 p.m.
