


i Heart Mount Airy

August 24th started some new traffic changes downtown. Park Avenue westbound traffic must turn right at Cross Street. Veterans Avenue is one way in the southbound direction, and Park Avenue is one way from Main Street to Cross Street in the eastbound direction. This is one of the first steps needed to allow Center Street to connect to Route 27.



New Dog Park Fencing!


